4. Greatest extent

- a. Three times attacked Vienna, Austria (1529, 1532, & 1683)
- b. 8 times larger than France

5. Decline

- a. Sultans "imprisoned" within the Seraglio (1595 onward)
- b. Janissaries fought efforts to modernize
- c. Tax revenues pilfered before they reached Constantinople
- d. Lost revenues when trade shifted overseas
- e. Unable to conquer major powers—this minimized the land they could annex
- f. The decline of the Ottoman empire in Europe helped trigger World War I, as Russia and Austria jostled for power in the Balkans, and England and France rushed to maintain a balance of power there
